

£1.2n cash injection boosts Superfast Broadband plans in the County

Almost 3,300 homes and businesses in parts of the Northampton Waterside Enterprise Zone, Grange Park and Northampton town centre are all a step closer to having access to superfast broadband (download speeds above 24Mbps) thanks to an extension of the Superfast Northampton Project.

Over the past few months, the County council has been working with BT on the extension of plans being delivered as part of the first stage of the Superfast Northamptonshire project. Work to plan and build the new fibre network is underway and will be completed by the end of March 2016. More than 880 properties in Grange park and 2,400 in the Northampton are set to benefit including 180 (c. 85% superfast coverage) in the Waterside Enterprise Zone.

A £1.2m boost to investment was secured by the County Council in 2014 and includes public funds of £614,000. BT is also contributing £613,000. It brings the total value of the County Council's first contract with BT to £12.8m including £4.08m from the County Council, £3.9m from BT and £277,000 collectively from South Northamptonshire Council, Northampton Borough Council and Grange Park Parish Council.

There may be some variances in content between both editions.

Grange Park was previously part of BT's commercial roll-out plans but the discovery of T-PON technology (Telephony Over Passive Optical network) changed the viability of a commercial solution. T-PON is not normally compatible with the fibre to the cabinet technology BT uses to roll out superfast broadband services. This meant that public funding was needed if an upgrade was to be built. BT has already started the planning and survey work required to determine the best solution for Grange Park.

Securing access to superfast broadband in the Enterprise Zone is strategically important for the county's economy and to maximise inward investment, growth and business retention in the area. Having access to superfast speeds of above 24Mbps (and speeds up to 80Mbps for those premises located closest to the new fibre cabinets) will help businesses to become digitally efficient and enhance business growth.

The Northampton Waterside Enterprise Zone is the largest urban enterprise zone in the UK. It is made up of more than 20 sites stretching along the River Nene from Sixfields in the west, right across the town centre, it comprises global brands sitting alongside thriving small businesses, and will include the University of Northampton which has made a £330m commitment to relocate its campuses to the Zone's eastern section.

Cllr Andre Gonzalez De Savage, County council cabinet member for Strategic Infrastructure and Public Protection, said:

"This is more great news for the county and takes superfast plans secured with public investment to over 73,850 premises. When combined with commercial coverage this means that 95% of premises in the county are expected to have access to superfast broadband once delivered".

"Securing connectivity for business is critical to support their success and the Northampton Waterside Enterprise Zone continues to be a key focus for infrastructure investment for the county and borough councils".

Steve Henderson, BT's Regional Director of Next Generation Access said:

"More and more small businesses are now trading far beyond just their local area so a fibre broadband connection is a key part of a successful future for the Waterside Enterprise Zone. Equally, those living in Grange Park will be pleased to have access to superfast speeds and the many entertainment and learning opportunities it brings".

The County Council has set an ambitious target to secure countywide coverage of superfast broadband by the end of 2017, working with Government, local partners and telecoms providers. These latest plans take us another step closer towards this.

When and Where

Since Superfast Northamptonshire marked the launch of the first fibre cabinet delivered by the project in February 2014, 161 new fibre cabinets have been stood, connected and have gone 'live' to support superfast broadband services. This has involved planning and laying over 250km of new optical fibre to extend the broadband network.

Fibre coverage built through the project has now reached 39,000 premises (as of January 2015) of which over 35,700 should have access to superfast broadband (download speeds above 24Mbps). Without public funding from the County Council and BDUK, channelled through the Superfast Northamptonshire project these premises would not be benefitting from access to faster broadband services. Since our last newsletter in December the communities of Aldwinckle, Charlton, East Haddon, Eydon, Hinton, Lower Boddington, Newbottle, Thorpe Manderville, Upper Boddington and Woodford Halse have gone live.

Getting superfast broadband is not automatic if you are in an upgraded area. You need to contact your internet service provider to ask

about an upgrade or go online to compare offers available by different providers who are selling services in your area. To be able to buy a fibre broadband service you normally need to have a minimum access line speed of 15Mbps.

What's coming next?

Further upgrades are now at the planning and survey stage, involving an additional 89 new fibre cabinets in 41 different exchange areas across the county and there's more to come. By the end of March 2016 over 53,400 premises in Northamptonshire will have access to superfast broadband involving the deployment of around 300 new fibre cabinets.

Gigaclear's roll out of ultrafast broadband begins in rural Northamptonshire

Over 5000 residential and business premises in rural Northamptonshire villages will soon be able to benefit from broadband services up to 1000Mbps as Gigaclear builds its first fibre networks in the county.

Gigaclear is an independent telecoms provider that specialises in building and operating pure fibre broadband networks supporting gigabit connections to rural communities. This Fibre to the Premise technology brings fibre all the way

to your property and does not rely on the existing copper network. Gigaclear is investing £5m in Northamptonshire through its commercial plans, without the need for public funding. The company currently expects to serve as many as 30 villages across the county.

The installation of the new "ultrafast broadband cabinets" has begun in West Haddon, Guilsborough, Coton and Ravensthorpe, where four cabinets in total will boost download speeds by 70 times the rural average. In this area of Northamptonshire the plan is to reach 2500 premises across these villages and Hollowell, Creaton, Scaldwell and surrounds.

Ravensthorpe parish councillor David Herbert is thrilled at the prospect "It will move us from the digital dark ages" he said. "It will be a remarkable improvement and it means we will be able to access all kinds of facilities required for modern life".

"Joe Frost, Gigaclear's Sales and Marketing Director, said "We are very grateful for the support from Northamptonshire County Council and the local Parish Councils, especially David, a local parish councillor and broadband champion".

Another 2 cabinets have been installed in the villages of King's Cliffe and Apethorpe in East Northamptonshire. Local residents and businesses here will be able to take up ultrafast broadband services by May. Gigaclear expects to complete its installations across 20 villages in the county during 2015 and plans to extend further where there is clear demand for ultrafast services from the local communities.

Heather Smith, Deputy Leader of Northamptonshire County Council said: "I am delighted to see the work that Gigaclear is undertaking to bring ultrafast broadband to King's Cliffe and Apethorpe. This is great news as current broadband speeds are very poor. Attracting commercial investment by telecoms providers is critical if the county council's ambitious target to see full coverage by the end of 2017 is to be met. Gigaclear will provide these villages with vital ultrafast connectivity which will bring significant benefits to small local businesses, residents looking to work from home and also other social uses such as iPlayer and Smart TV's.

Satellite Experience for Glapthorn Farmer – One Year On

A year ago Bruce Wilkinson, who farms almost 500 acres at Glapthorn, near Oundle in East Northamptonshire had his slow and unreliable broadband service transformed by Avonline Broadband. Bruce won free installation and supply of a new satellite broadband system as the prize for taking part in a Broadband Survey carried out by Northamptonshire County Council, working in partnership with the national Farmers Union (NFU) and Avonline Broadband.

A satellite dish was installed at Bruce's farm in just a few hours, giving him immediate access to much faster download speeds over the internet. Satellite is not classed as a 'Next Generation' broadband technology but it can provide speeds of up to 22Mbps download and 6Mbps upload speed. Avonline Broadband is one of a number of satellite service providers in the UK.

Bruce said, "Now Defra* files, that used to take an age are downloaded in seconds and can be returned just as rapidly. Complying with online return requirements simply have not been a problem since we had satellite broadband installed. It has been totally reliable, and is simply there and easy to use at all times."

Bruce, and his wife Liz, who runs an agricultural training business from home were so impressed with the improvements to their broadband speed that they have renewed their subscription. It made an impression on Bruce's son too.

"My son was told by his service provider that because of where he lives he is unlikely to be receiving any better internet access – so now he has got satellite broadband too".

Satellite broadband can be accessed in almost every location in the UK – on top of a mountain, in the middle of the countryside, in a small isolated village or a city street. Services can be affected by tree cover and bad weather. It has proved popular with the agricultural industry where properties are located more remotely from fibre broadband networks. Avonline has connected over 2000 farming related properties across the country, including 150 in Northamptonshire.

Fast and reliable broadband speed is vital to the Evergreen Art Cafe's business as over 60% of the sales are made online. Before the advent of superfast broadband it would take a long time to upload data due to the sheer volume and data size of images, this wasted time can be costly to a business.

Typically the gallery will show an image of the artwork presented together with a piece about the artist and a link through to their website. With superfast broadband speeds, the Art Cafe is now able to provide this high level of information and process finance applications and payments online in superfast time.

The Evergreen Art Cafe uses superfast broadband to sell its contemporary art to clients across the globe in countries such as France, China and Australia. Superfast broadband has played a key part in the success of this now international company based in a small Northamptonshire market town.

INV-ENT DIGITAL – Applications exceed expectations

INV-ENT Digital was launched by the County Council in November 2014. It is the latest initiative in support of the digital economy and offers grant funding to local SMEs (small and medium sized enterprises). It is targeted at ambitious SMEs looking to take advantage of enhanced digital capacity/capabilities to grow and transform their business. The first round which was reported in the December edition of the Newsletter has now closed.

SMEs were invited to apply for up to £10,000 on a match fund basis for investment in IT and digital related activities to support growth.

Businesses have applied to the scheme to enhance their online presence and capabilities, investing in new technologies such as software or hardware, accessing new revenue streams through e-commerce, up-skilling existing staff or securing new staff with digital capabilities. It is anticipated that applicants will be notified in March 2015 of the outcome.

The scheme has proved to be very popular, with over 80 applications received – and over £700,000 of grant funding requested from an available County Council fund of £187,000.

Free digital workshops and webinars for Northamptonshire businesses

A series of free interactive webinars will be run in March exploring the basics of cyber security, how to get started in social media and on digital marketing strategy. Key considerations for business growth such as tactics and approaches to customer interaction, how search engines work and data protection will also be covered. The sessions are being delivered by Northamptonshire Enterprise Partnership (NEP) in association with Northamptonshire Growth Hub and will be available to all Northamptonshire Businesses.

Following the webinars, participants will have the opportunity to access further mentoring support either online or through a more formal mentoring programme. The webinars are part of NEP's programme of FREE digital support which also includes 'Digital Health checks' which are running until the end of March.
